

Submission Guidelines for *Hand in Hand*

We encourage submissions to *Hand in Hand (HiH)* that focus on general rather than discipline-specific issues in teaching, especially articles that are creative, respectful, and recognize the best in all of us. Articles can be on teaching philosophies, technology, pedagogy, or book reviews, but should be no more than 600 words. Articles should be submitted for review in Word to jslattery.

We are looking for articles from a range of perspectives and writers from different fields and diverse backgrounds and approaches. Because articles must be relatively short, there are several things to think about in your submission:

1. Communicate your ideas as cleanly and clearly as possible.
2. Because readers come from a variety of fields, avoid jargon and technical language not readily understood by an educated reader outside your discipline.
3. Provide detail and examples showing how your ideas might be applied in your teaching and field. In some cases, it may be helpful to post assignments, charts or examples on our server and link to these.
4. You can expect that most articles will be read fairly quickly. Catchy titles can be helpful in quickly communicating your ideas and grabbing readers. In general, titles should be no longer than 25 characters, including spaces.

We take different approaches in our teaching. Issues will be thematically-organized, but will often emphasize the diversity in views and approaches that we take. As when we're teaching, our goal is to encourage thought and discussion and we feel most successful when we've done that.
